# Vintage License Plates

## What You Can and Cannot Do In California

A vintage license plate can be the crowning touch of authenticity on a Model A. But few owners are lucky enough to have the original plates on their car. Whether you find a set of well-worn old plates for cheap at a parts swap meet or purchase a pristine restored pair for serious money, the real challenge can be dealing with your state DMV office and getting permission to legally mount them on your car.

California – Land of the Disgruntled DMV Employee

No need to mince words: the California DMV is not the most public-spirited bureaucracy on the planet. It can be a trying experience attempting to convince the clerk behind the counter that the law does allow vintage license plate use in certain specific circumstances under the "Year of Manufacture" (YOM) statute, Section 5004.1 of the California Motor Vehicle Code. I have had DMV employees tell me that there is no such law, and that what I am trying to do is impossible. So take a printout of that webpage with you! And for S.F. Bay Area residents, here's a tip: the Santa Clara DMV is much more hip to the YOM rules than some other DMV offices. They even have a huge display on the wall of every CA plate style since they first started issuing them in 1914, which is interesting from a historical point of view.

California law allows owners of 1962 model year cars or older to use vintage plates issued in the same year on their car if the plates are legible and "clear", meaning not currently in use. Since each plate number is unique, and you have to bring into the DMV a matched pair of plates, that should prove they are not in use, but it's not always that simple. Errors in the DMV records may show they are in use when they are clearly not (assuming your vintage plates are legitimate and not modern copies!). Note that the law does not require that the vintage plates be the same as those originally issued with the car. Kit cars of vintage automobiles do not qualify for YOM plates.

Up until 1952, CA plate styles for almost all years showed a year number stamped into the plate, or a metal tab showing the year was attached to the plate.

Application requirements are as follows:

- 1. Complete the Application for YOM License Plates (REG. 352). This for may also be used for YOM plate retention.
- 2. Submit YOM plates for authentication by DMV employee.
- 3. Fees
  - a. Registration fee
  - b. Vehicle License fee and weight fee (if any)
  - c. \$35 YOM plate fee
  - d. Other fees may be due
- 4. Surrender current plates

Once a YOM application is completed, a special black metal sticker well will be mailed from headquarters for displaying expiration sticker. A PFR sticker, which show both the month and year of expiration, will accompany the sticker well bolts either above or below the YOM plate. The sticker well along with your new registration will be mailed out in approximately 30 days.

#### California Vehicle Code

**Model Year Date License Plates** 

5004.1. (a) An owner of any vehicle that is a 1962 or older model year vehicle may, after the requirements for the registration of the vehicle have been complied with and with the approval of the department, utilize license plates of this state with the date of year corresponding to the model year date when the vehicle was manufactured, if the model year date license plate is legible and serviceable, as determined by the department, in lieu of the license plates otherwise required by this code. The department may consult with an organization of old car hobbyists in determining whether the date of year of the license plate to be used corresponds to the model year date when the vehicle was manufactured.

(b) A fee of thirty-five dollars (\$35) shall be

charged for the application for use of the special plates.

(c) In addition to the regular renewal fee for the vehicle for which the plates are authorized, the applicant for a renewal of the plates shall be charged an additional fee of ten dollars (\$10). When payment of a regular vehicle renewal fee is not required by this code, the holder of any license plates with a date corresponding to the model year may retain the plates upon payment of an annual fee of twenty dollars (\$20), which shall be due at the expiration of the registration year of the vehicle to which the plate was last assigned under this section.

(d) Whenever any person who has been authorized to utilize the special license plates applies to the department for transfer of the plates to another vehicle, a transfer fee of twelve dollars (\$12) shall be charged in addition to all other appropriate fees.

#### **Aries Limited Muffler Factory Tour**



#### **Tech Tip**

#### Moto Meter sensor extension

If your radiator cap has a moto meter with the wings option, you'll find the sensor is raised approximately 1/2" above the normal level and you may not get an accurate reading. To overcome this, cut the extension hooks off a Model A brake shoe spring and use just the spring part to screw over the moto meter sensor (The diameter is close enough to fit snugly without any additional work.) This will act as a heat sink and conduct the heat via conduction to the thermometer.



**Refreshments:** Barry Kinney will bring refreshments and some never before seen slides of the MAFCA meeting in Portland Oregon.


