President's Message

The last twelve months have been an awful time for our families, our institutions, and our businesses. However, I think we have good reason to believe that this pandemic is coming to an end. I don't want to play down the need to be cautious. However, given the decline in the number of new cases, it looks like we may be back to normal before year's end.

The proof that things are improving is in the numbers. I did a little number crunching to improve my understanding of where we may be headed with regard to the pandemic. I found that since January 1, 2021 the number of new cases and the numbers of deaths have dropped dramatically.

For example, on April 19, 2021, twenty four States reported zero deaths and twenty six States reported under 50 deaths. In addition, thirty seven States reported that the number of new cases had dropped to fewer than 1000 and ten of those States reported fewer than 100 new cases. Only the State of Michigan reported an increase in the number of new cases for April 19, 2021.

So the numbers indicate that fewer Americans are getting sick or seriously ill and fewer are dying due to Covid-19 infection. The numbers seem to indicate that the vaccinations are working and the nation is approaching herd immunity.

I am optimistic. I don't think it will be long before we resume normal family life, our institutions serve the public in a normal way, and our businesses fully reopen.
